
## **BOOK ANALYSIS**

#### **Blurb:**

A simple text, with repeated refrains to join in with, 'My mum' is a celebration of mothers and all they do for their children. There is often a mis-match between the text and illustrations, encouraging children to look beyond the literal meaning to find hints of sarcasm and comedy.

## **Author background:**

Anthony Browne was born in Sheffield and went to grammar school. Following the death of his father, he began using drawing to tell stories, while working as a medical artist in hospitals. He has written and illustrated over 50 children's books.

## **Cultural background:**

At this point in the year, our focus is on helping the children tell their story – who they are and who is important to them. This book provides a familiar context for them to refer to.

#### **Literary terms:**

(Use of repetition) – the refrain is repeated on each page, but with the addition of repeated words: *My mum is very, very nice.*
