People celebrate with family and friends. Special food and meals are often eaten during celebrations, such as samosas, mince pies or sufganiyot.

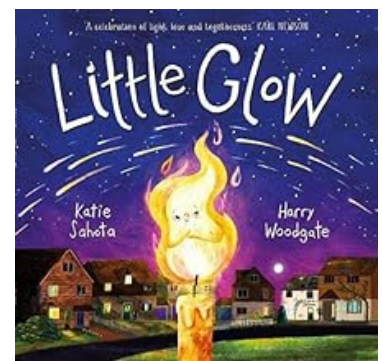
People may give gifts or wear special clothes during some celebrations.
